Her years as an in-home daycare provider simply enlarged her extended family to include the parents who looked to her for advice and the kids who called her Aunt Marlene or NeNe. She was also a volunteer foster mother for babies awaiting adoption through Catholic Charities. There was no baby she couldn't calm. She was an active parishioner at Most Holy Rosary Catholic Church in Upper Marlboro, Maryland since 1972. She taught CCD for many years and

was especially fond of teaching second grade, where she prepared students to receive the sacraments of Penance and Holy Communion for the first time.

The light of her life was her grandson, Christopher O'Brien. His younger years included an unexpectedly large number of lightsaber fights, kitchen hockey games and games with his Grammy. In later years, she loved watching him play soccer and wanted to hear all about his adventures and achievements. Anyone who talked to her for more than five minutes knew all about him and saw his pictures.
